Biography of Mrs. Aliza Zaftian Halavy



Aliza Taftian Halavy, wife of the late Sion Cyrus Halavy and a mother of four, was born in Tehran, Iran. Her longtime passion for community activism and philanthropy began in 1944, when she became a member of the Jewish Brotherhood & Sisterhood Organization in Tehran. In 1949, Mrs. Halavy moved to the newly established State of Israel to pursue a post-secondary education in nursing. She attended Municipal Hadassah Medical Center in Tel Aviv, and specialized Midwifery. She completed 4 years of schooling & residency with an additional 3 years as a midwife, where she delivered many babies.

Mrs. Halavy met and married ber husband, Sion Cyrus Halavy, in Israel In 1951. After moving back to Iran, she was recruited by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (which was then and remains today the world's leading Jewish humanitarian organization) to work as President of the Children's Health Department at the Kanoun Kheir Khah Hospital for 7 years. The rising specter of revolution in Iran prompted Mrs. Halavy to move to Los Angeles in 1978. Mrs. Halavy became a board member of the Iranian Jewish Women's Organization (IJWO) in 1982 and served as president of the IJWO from 1997 to 2002. Mrs. Aliza Halavy remains an active board member of the organization till today.


Objectives of Iranian Jewish Women's Organization:

The objective of this organization, in addition to its social, cultural and charitable Activities, has been to protect the dual identity of the Iranian Jewish community in

Los Angeles, as well as to recognize the impact and role of Iranian Jewish Women in society.

Sion Cyrus Halavy

was born in Hamedan, Iran and began his career in Teberan in infrastructure development. At the age of 29, Mr. Halavy immigrated to the newly independent State of Israel and immediately secured a job as a broadcaster for "Sedaye Iran," a Persian radio news program. In 1951, Mr. Halavy married Aliza Taftian, and moved between Israel and Iran several times until he finally relocated to the United States in 1978 to settle in Los Angeles.



Following his move to the United States, Mr. Halavy became a regular contributor to the newsmagazines Rabe Zendegi and Donyay-e Yahood, along with a number of other Persian language publications. In 1987 Mr. Halavy wrote a book in Farsi titled "The Yom Kippur War". This book was partially translated using various resources, including Hebrew books and magazines. As a great donator to various causes to the State of Israel, Mr. Halavy donated all proceeds from the sales of the book to various organizations in Israel. Sion Cyrus Halavy continued his writings, contributions and devotions to the State of Israel till couple years before his passing in 2010.
